Announcing the Grand Junction Native American Arts Auction & Appraisal Clinic by the R.B. Burnham & Co. Trading Post April 8-9, 2016



On April 8-9, Museums of Western Colorado will host a special Native American Art Auction, conducted by R.B. Burnham & Co. Trading Post as a benefit for the MWC. If you like Native Arts, you will love this sale. Featured will be approximately 250 pieces of Navajo, Hopi, and Zuni weavings; baskets; pottery; katsinas; jewelry; and other art creations.

At 6 p.m. Friday, April 8, there will be a free reception and presentation from fourth-generation trader Bruce Burnham. It will be followed by an appraisal clinic, where Mr. Burnham and his team will do an informal verbal evaluation of your personal Native Art treasure for \$10 per item. Reservations are required and can be made via the MWC.

The preview for the auction will be held from 10:00 a.m. to noon Saturday, April 9. Around 250 Native American art pieces will be available for viewing. Each item is either coming directly from the artisan or Burnham & Co. The auction will

start at 1:00 p.m. and continue until all pieces are gone. Admission to the auction is free. There is a 10% buyers' premium. Also present will be Ute and Paiute artisan vendors.

This event is being hosted in conjunction with the Horizon Drive Business Improvement District and Grand Vista Hotel. All events are at the Grand Vista Hotel, located at 2790 Crossroads Blvd., near the airport. For more information, see the MWC website or call the Museums.





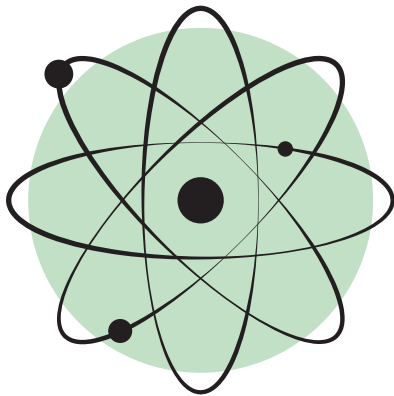

Early Trails and Wagon Roads Trip

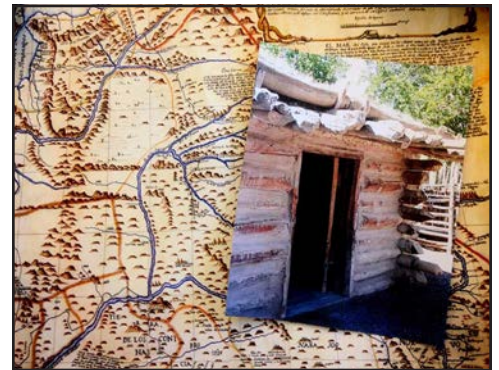

We will then head to Fort Uncompahgre in Delta, Colorado. The fort is a re-creation of the original fur trading post established by Antoine Robidoux in 1826. The costumed interpreters will give an interactive tour of life during the Mountain Man era. Our next stop will be the Museum of the Mountain West in Montrose for a guided tour of settlement era town buildings that tell the story of early western Colorado.

This 8-mile, round-trip moderate hike into Dominguez-Escalante National Conservation Area starts at historic Bridgeport and goes up the Big Dominguez Canyon.

On April 8-9, MWC will host a special **Native American Art Auction** fundraiser being conducted by R.B. Burnham & Co. Trading Post. If you like Native Arts, you will love this sale. May 7 will see Cross Orchards Historic Site open for the season with **Spring Day on the Farm**. There is an opening reception at the Museum of the West on May 12 to celebrate the *Western Colorado Weaponry: Tools of Survival and Conflict* exhibit. A week later, on May 19 at Dinosaur Journey, brace yourself for the opening reception of the *T. rex and the End of the "Age of Dinosaurs"* exhibit.

As we roll into the summer, be ready to enjoy an even bigger and better **Dinosaur Day** on its new date of June 11. In July, Cross Orchards will host a **King n'Trio concert** on the 22nd. Then on August 27, MWC will be pleased to present its annual unique and fantastic fundraising gala, **Feast of Skulls**. And every Thursday in July and August, come to Museum of the West for its **Cool Summer Nights**.

September 16-17, the **11th Annual Two Rivers Chautauqua** will feature active "discussions" between Abraham Lincoln and Jefferson Davis on one evening, and Eleanor Roosevelt and Nikita Khrushchev the next.
